# John 17 The High Priestly Prayer

(17) What does "sanctify" mean in verse 17 and 19?

- A. Leviticus 22:32; Ezekiel 20:12; Acts 26:18.
- B. Romans 15:16
- C. 1 Corinthians 1:2; 6:11; Hebrews 10:10

(19) What does "consecrate" mean in this verse? (See footnote in ESV bible.)

## John 17:20-26 Jesus Prays for All Believers

(25) What does Jesus call the Father?

Which verses show that the unity of believers is meant to be a witness to the world?

Does knowing that Jesus has prayed for you give you comfort? Enjoy this quote from Morgan: "He prayed for them. He prays for us. He knew His intercession for them would prevail. He knows His intercession for us will prevail. Then let us rest in Him, with the rest of loving obedience and of surest confidence. (Morgan)"
